The CARE Center of New Jersey is thrilled to announce that we have been awarded a remarkable grant of \$1,025,000 by the State of New Jersey to scale our Food for HOPE program. This generous support will enable us to expand our care for the community by decreasing the problem of food insecurity in the Garden State.

Our Food for HOPE program supports the words of Jesus when He said, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink" (Matthew 25:35). With this new funding, we'll be able to expand and improve our services while maintaining a high standard of responsibility and care.

One of the first steps will be hiring a dynamic Program Manager who will bring their expertise and dedication to oversee our expanded operations. We are also thrilled to welcome two full-time Volunteer Coordinators and a Truck/Van Driver to our team, ensuring that our efforts run seamlessly and efficiently.

Thanks to the grant, we are upgrading our storage facilities, and we will invest in a refrigerated transport van and a grocery-style truck, enabling us to deliver fresh, nutritious food to more people than ever before.

Our commitment to community engagement and comprehensive support services is stronger than ever. In addition to providing food, The CARE Center offers wrap-around services, including financial literacy training, mental health services, and much more to help the under-resourced.

IMPACT STORIES

Deaconess Sandy Bugg's journey with Food for HOPE is deeply personal. Growing up in Pittsburgh, PA, as one of eight siblings, Sandy (shown above) knew the sting of going without. Yet, in the midst of their own struggles, her mother's kindness shone through, sending Sandy into the neighborhood with bags of food for those in need. Today, Sandy carries that same spirit of compassion to the front lines of the fight against food insecurity, tirelessly serving through her ministry at The CARE Center and as the Director of Church Life at Christ Church. Her life is a testament to the power of giving, shaped by the love and generosity she experienced as a child.

When Sandy met Mr. Stewart, an elderly man who had become homebound and semi-mobile, it proved to be a seminal moment. Twice a week, Sandy's mother sent her to deliver food to him. Each time, Sandy found Mr. Stewart sitting in his doorway, staring out into the streets, waiting. His deep gratitude for the meals touched Sandy's heart in a way that still motivates her today. His simple thankfulness sparked a lifelong commitment in Sandy to show kindness to the poor. As Scripture beautifully reminds us, "Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the Lord, and he will reward them for what they have done" (Proverbs 19:17, NIV).

Food insecurity is often just the beginning for many individuals and families. Sandy shares, "Our ministry team sees firsthand that addressing food alone isn't enough. The struggles run deeper, and to truly uplift the marginalized, we need the transformative power of God." The CARE Center is devoted to being a vessel for this change through a comprehensive approach that goes beyond providing meals by demonstrating care for the whole person.
